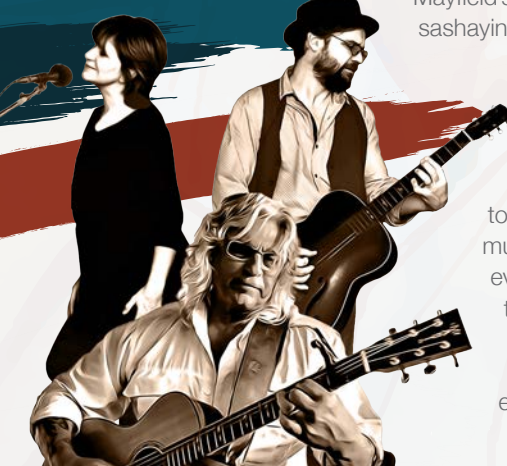
Passerine's distinctive sound combines vocal harmonies, the crisp rhythms of an acoustic guitar, the haunting voices of the fiddle and dobro (resonator slide guitar), and the resonant lows of an acoustic bass. With inventive vocal harmonies and songwriting, supported by the sounds of acoustic strings, Passerine offers a fresh take on traditional folk and bluegrass music as well as a repertoire of original songs that range from sweet ballads to the edgier side of contemporary Americana.

Founding member of the Americana duo **Reckless Saints**, Roy Schneider, has been performing his original music for the past two decades. His songs have thrice made him a Kerrville New Folk finalist, and was a contestant on NBC's *The Voice* in 2013.

Reviewers have described Kim Mayfield's music as 'pearly and sashaying,' 'pleasantly invoking the legendary Tammy Wynette,' and 'haunted by Patsy Cline.' Ray Cerbone's storyteller style takes the listener to another place in time, his music and lyrics bringing evocative insights into the many sides of life. His inventive fingerstyle guitar is uniquely diverse and easy-on-the-ears.

John Butler first played music for money during the Johnson administration, and his songwriting has garnered prizes at the Kerrville New Folk competition, the Will McLean Music Festival and the South Florida Folk Festival. When she was three years old, vocalist Susan Chastain made her musical debut atop her mother's bar in Oklawaha, Florida. Since then, this Detroit Music Award winner has sung in combos ranging from casual duos to a 25-year stint with a Big Band. Susie Hulcher is an energetic vocalist, compelling songwriter and versatile bassist and guitarist. Together, Butler, Chastain and Hulcher create rich harmony as **Little Fools**.

Since 2013, the **Baron-Navarro Piano Duo** has performed a wide range of music for two pianos and piano four hands with electric energy and melting lyricism. An award-winning concert pianist, Michael Baron annually tours Europe and South America, and engagements throughout the United States and Asia. He serves as the Myra and Van Williams Distinguished Professor of Music and Head of Keyboard Studies at FGCU'S Bower School of Music. Peruvian pianist Priscila Navarro is the first-prize winner of several international competitions, including the Liszt-Garrison International Competition, the Imola City Awards, and the Heida Hermanns International Music Competition. She made her Carnegie Hall solo recital debut in 2013. After studying with Dr. Baron at FCGU, Navaro completed her Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the Frost School of Music. Recently, the duo celebrated their Carnegie Hall debut and the international release of their CD of French music for two pianos.

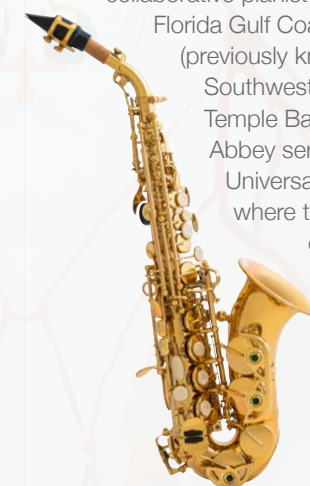

Shawn and Abbey Allison are the Allison Duo, a saxophone and piano duo based in Southwest Florida. Formed in 2003, The Allison Duo is dedicated to performing music that features saxophone and piano in equal roles, with repertoire ranging from classical transcriptions, to jazz, to klezmer, to the latest music for saxophone and piano. Shawn and Abbey married in 2005 and have two children, both of whom love to make music. Perhaps someday there will be an Allison Quartet!

Shawn is a composer and saxophonist, who teaches composition at Florida Gulf Coast University. Abbey is a collaborative pianist, working with the choral program at Florida Gulf Coast University, as well as Choral Artistry (previously known as the Symphonic Chorale of Southwest Florida). She also plays for services at Temple Bat Yam on Sanibel. Together, Shawn and Abbey serve as music co-directors at the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Greater Naples, where they play music during services and conduct and accompany the choir. They also work together as conductor and accompanist of the Bay Singers of Bonita Bay and Shawn and Abbey are both founding members of the Nautilus Chamber Players, an organization that presents concerts of chamber music written after 1900.

Violinist Renata Arado and pianist Erik Entwistle, both Sanibel residents, have been performing together for the past six years. Arado teaches at the Canterbury School and Aspen Music Festival. She began violin instruction in the Suzuki method at age two in Chicago. Arado is currently concertmaster of both the Southwest Florida Symphony and The Gulf Coast Symphony in Fort Myers, an artistic council advisor for BIG ARTS Concert Series on Sanibel, and an artist-faculty of the Aspen Music Festival and School. Pianist, musicologist and composer Entwistle received musical degrees from Dartmouth College, Washington University in St. Louis, and University of California, Santa Barbara. He performs frequently, most recently with the BIG ARTS Concert Band, and accompanied the Sanibel Community Chorus for four years. His recordings appear on the Summit Records label.

Isaac Fernández Hernández will take you through a journey in time and places as he performs pieces with instruments from all over the world. Isaac received his Master of Music degree from Boston University under the supervision of timpanist Tim Genis and completed his undergraduate studies at Oberlin Conservatory of Music. Isaac is also an alumnus from the Interlochen Arts Academy where he originated his percussion studies after moving away from his home country, Costa Rica, at the age of 16. He was appointed as section percussionist of the Southwest Florida Symphony in 2014 and in 2015, he made his Carnegie Hall debut as principal timpanist of the International Youth Philharmonic Orchestra. He performs regularly with the Naples Philharmonic, Jacksonville Symphony, Sarasota Orchestra, Sarasota Opera, Orlando Philharmonic, The Florida Orchestra and Palm Beach Opera and is a sponsored artist with the Zildjian Avedis family.
